The Three Guardsmen, Law and Order for Oklahoma Territories

Leading the fight for law and order in the territory were Deputy United States Marshalls Bill Tilghman, Heck Thomas, and Chris Madsen, known as the Three Guardsmen.

It wasn't until the turn of the century that lawmen began to win the battle against outlaws in Indian Territory and the surrounding states.

They went after Bill Doolin, of

the notorious Wild Bunch, and Tilghman captured him in Eureka Springs, Arkansas. He was taken to federal jail in Guthrie, IT, where He later escaped and was tracked down by Heck Thomas east of Stillwater. Doolin fired on the lawmen and was killed in a hail of bullets. In 1924 Bill Tilghman was murdered by a federal agent in Cromwell, OK. His body was taken to the rotunda of the state capitol, where thousands of Okla-

homa citizens paid their respects to one of the Three Guardsmen who had fought the outlaws in the territorial days.

Thomas died in 1912 of natural causes and is credited with the arrest of 300 criminals.

Chris Madsen died in 1944 at 92, in the Masonic home in Guthrie, OK after a long life and most interesting career.

BRIEF HISTORY OF COOKSON, OKLAHOMA

The town of Cookson took its name from Jack Cookson. Jack operated the local post office from his home, while it was still Indian Territory, before statehood. The town was located on the shore of the Illinois River near the Cookson Bluff area, and became a central point of business for the surrounding residents. The Ballew Brothers' Store was one of the first buildings in the area. They operated as a commu-

nity store. George Stratton eventually took over the store which also by then housed the post office. The first floor housed the store and post office. The top floor was home to the Anti-Thief Association. This building, along with several others, was moved to its present day location on Hwy 82, next to the post office of Cookson. Other structures of the original site were submerged when in 1947 the

US Corps of Engineers constructed the Tenkiller Dam to create Tenkiller Lake. Stop in to see the Cookson Country Store and Cabins.
